

## Post Doctoral position at the AgroParisTech-ENGREF, Research Centre of Nancy (in cooperation with the Institute of Forest and Environmental Policy, University of Freiburg, Germany)

**Duration of the contract:** 2 years

The Paris Institute of technology for life, food and environmental sciences, AgroParisTech, in its research centre of Nancy, invites applications from suitable candidates for the position of a full-time Post Doctoral Researcher. The PostDoc will work in the European research project 'European Beech Forests for the Future Ecological, Economic, and Policy Analysis of Beech Forest Conservation under the Natura 2000 Network'. He or she will contribute to the working group on "Governance" within the project consortium. This group is going to analyse institutional structures and processes of Natura 2000 implementation at different policy levels in order to understand the policy-relevant effects of the Directives and its effects on beech forest biodiversity conservation and management across Europe. A focus is thereby to understand how the EU forest biodiversity policy is affecting "local" forest policies across Europe over time. This research is conducted in a comparative manner across different EU member states.

The duration of the contract will be 2 years. The position is based at AgroParisTech-ENGREF Centre located in Nancy (14 rue Girardet, 54042 NANCY, France). Research will be conducted in close cooperation with the Institute of Forest and Environmental Policy, University of Freiburg, Germany.

## Main tasks:

The PostDoc is expected to

- conduct 2 empirical case studies on the implementation of Natura 2000 in France (in-depth interviews with policy stakeholders, participatory observation of policy processes within France),
- publish the results in international journals and contribute to respective joint publications of the project consortium,
- closely cooperate with the international partners in this interdisciplinary project; in particular, with scholars at the Institute of Forest and Environmental Policy, University of Freiburg,
- organize knowledge dissemination and stakeholder dialogue within France,
- contribute to the management and success of the overall project consortium

## Qualifications, Competencies & Experiences

Applicants should hold a PhD or equivalent in political sciences/public administration, forestry/rural sociology, or similar. They should have a profound interest in social scientific research, particularly in forest or environmental policy analysis.

The following competences are highly appreciated:

Good research record in conducting policy analyses

- Excellent inter-personal communication skills both in French and English (obligatory)
- Strong inter-personal skills and desire to contribute to an interdisciplinary European research project
- The ability to work both individually and in close cooperation with an international research team.

- Demonstrated experience in (environmental/land use) policy research
- Demonstrated experience in publishing and presenting research findings in the peerreviewed literature and at scientific conferences
